



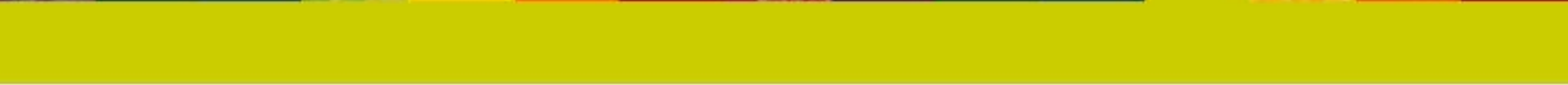

Digital resources

- Digital resource:
 - can be a moving image footage, painting, line drawing, map, photo, an audio file of songs or broadcasts or a set of items
- Sourced from various cultural institutions
- TLF develops an ‘educational value statement’ for each resource
- Unlocks rich cultural resources for Australian schools

- Film clips from over 1000 film and television programs from National Film and Sound Archive, National Archives of Australia, the ABC, SBS, and Film Australia

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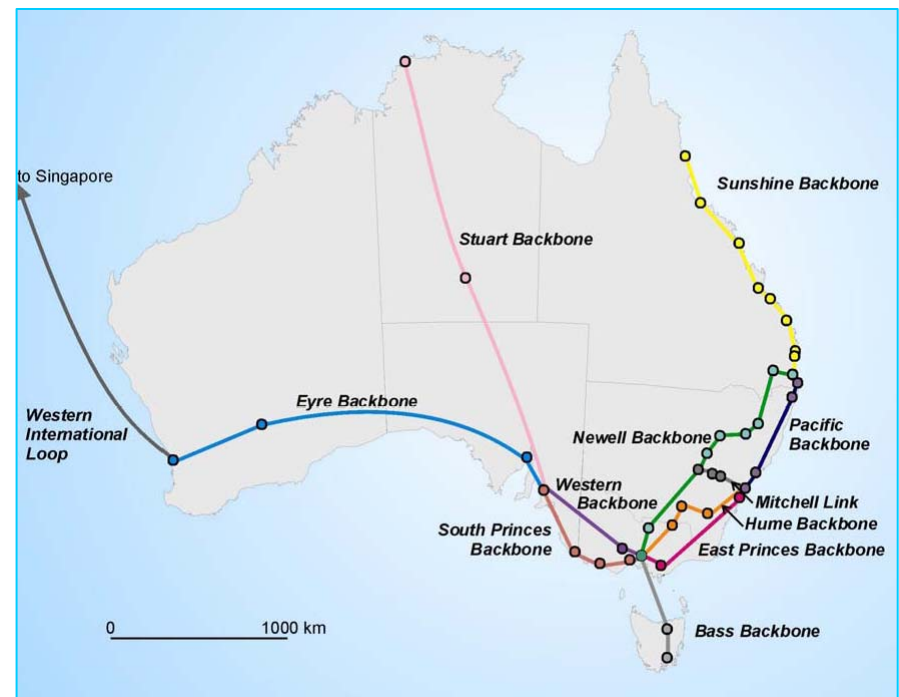

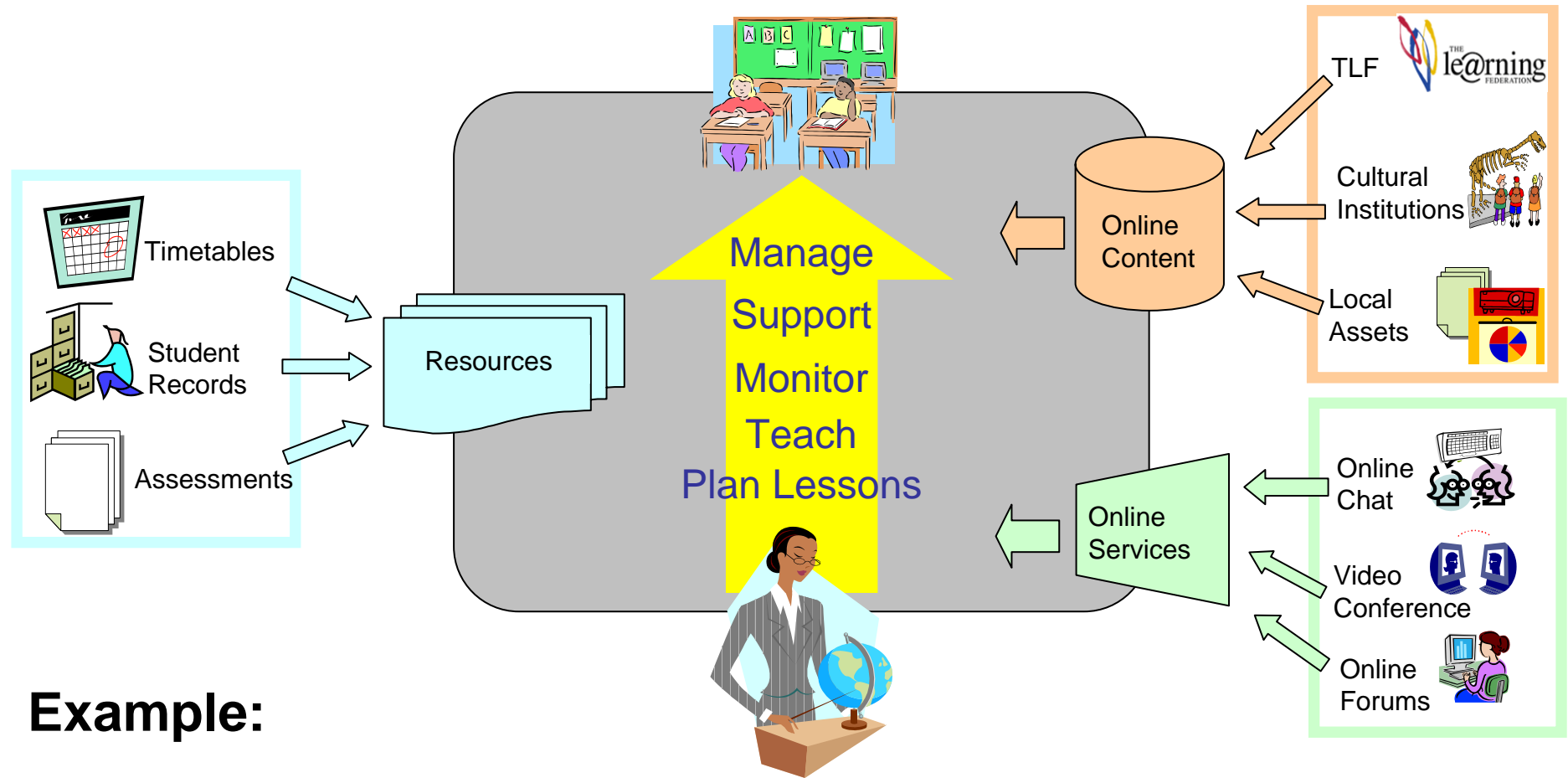
Australian Education Digital Network (AEDN)

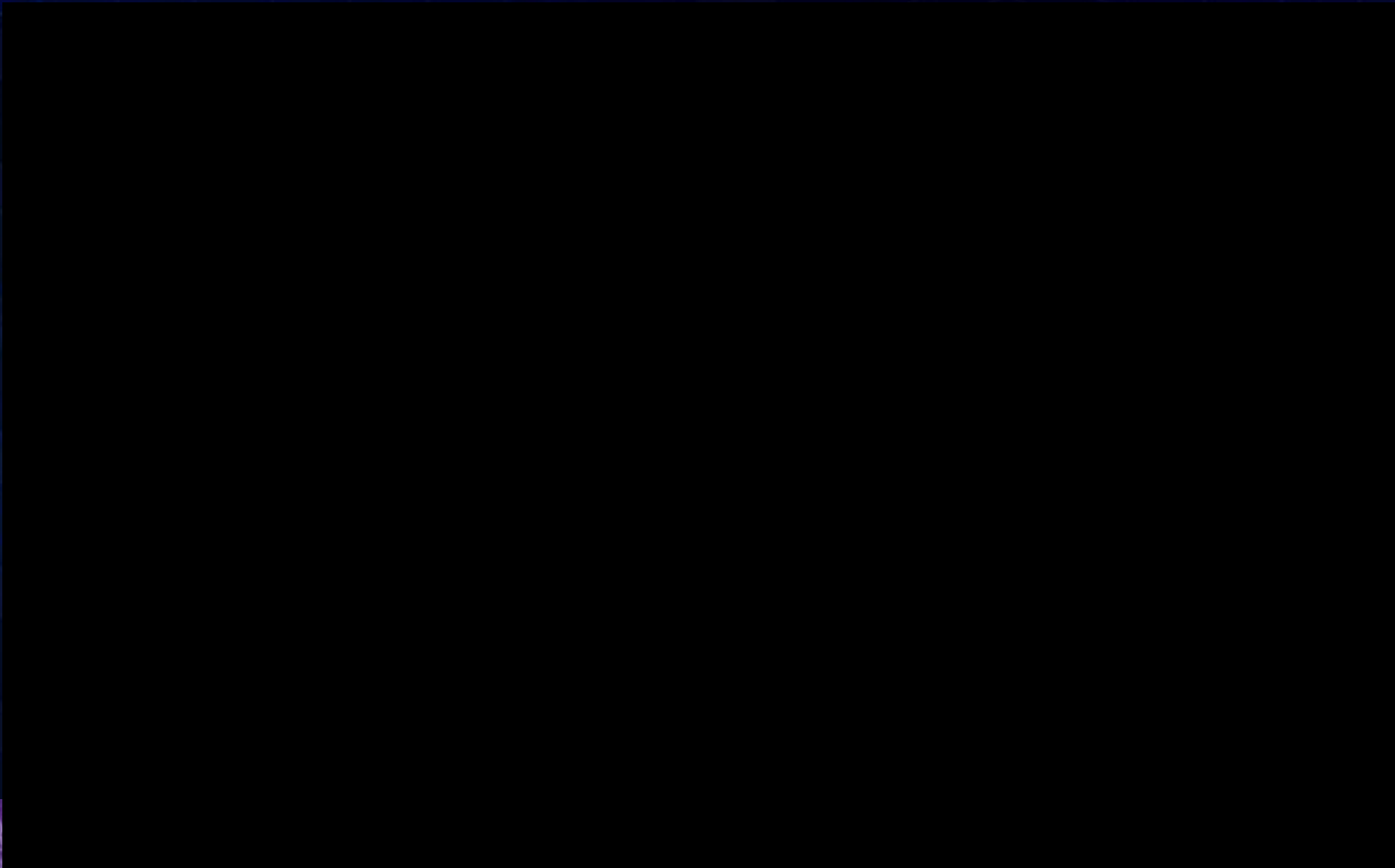
- **Print and digital copyright** management and practices present challenges for education
- United approach through CAG is delivering results
- National approaches to producing and licensing content, such as the TLF
- Digital copyright – Ministers lobbying the AG re Tell Students to View (TSTV)
- Potential of AEDN as a gateway to free for education and licensed content



Partnerships in ICT Learning (PICTL) project

- pilot projects in each state and territory involving collaboration by pre-service teachers, teachers and teacher educators
- teams focus on design of classroom activities involving the innovative use of ICTs
- work is intended to influence broader curriculum and pedagogical reform agendas at schools and universities





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
